

The purpose of this filing is to amortize the difference between interim rates established by Advice Letter 396-W, effective January 1, 2024, and the final rates authorized in Decision (D.) 24-12-030.

Background

These tariffs are submitted pursuant to by Administrative Law Judge's Ruling dated June 16, 2023, Granting Motion for Interim Rates and Creation of Memorandum Account in Suburban's Application (A.) 23-01-001, Ordering Paragraphs (OP) No. 1 and 2:

- "1. Suburban Water Systems' Motion for Interim Rates to be effective January 1, 2024, and request to create a memorandum account to track any differences between the interim rates and final rates is approved.
- 2. Suburban shall file a Tier 1 advice letter to establish the interim rates and memorandum account."

And, in compliance with OP No. 2 of D.24-12-030, Decision Resolving Suburban Water Systems' General Rate Case Increases for 2024-2026, issued on December 23, 2024, which states:

"Suburban Water Systems shall file a Tier 1 Advice Letter no later than 30 days from the effective date of this order to implement necessary retail rate changes to collect the adopted 2024 test year base revenue requirement in accordance with the directives of this decision and Commission General Order 96-B. Tariff sheets to implement these rate changes shall be attached to the Advice Letter with an effective date of January 1, 2024. Any undercollection due to this rate change shall be amortized from January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2026."

Suburban filed Advice Letter 396-W on November 17, 2023, to establish the Interim Rates Memorandum Account, and to implement the interim rates increase at the rate of inflation as compared to October 31, 2023, rates. Advice Letter 396-W was approved by Water Division on January 2, 2024, with an effective date of January 1, 2024.

Suburban has determined the difference between the rates authorized by D.24-12-030 compared to the interim rates authorized by ALJ's Ruling on June 16, 2023, for the recorded period January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024, and the estimated period January 1, 2025, through February 28, 2025. The total revenue shortfall is then calculated using recorded customer and consumption information for period January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024, and utilize the recorded December 2024 as the basis for the estimated months for January – February 2025. Suburban will true-up these estimated months revenue at the end of the recovery period. In addition, Suburban has included the residual over and under collection balances from previously authorized interim rates amortization.

Excluding Customer Assistance Program (CAP) of under-billed surcharge of \$501,523 and CAP under-credited \$218,049, which will be amortized over one year, the total calculated revenue shortfall including the residual previously authorized interim rates before interest will be amortized over the twelve or twenty-two months period, as applicable, is \$6,947,764 or 6.38% of Suburban's authorized revenue for Escalation Year 2025. The estimated annual amortization on the interim rates true-up including interest is approximately \$3,622,430 or 3.33% of Suburban's adopted water revenues for escalation year 2025.

Suburban is requesting to recover the revenue shortfall until the balance is fully amortized or approximately one-year for Private Fire Protection Service, and twenty-two months for other rate schedules. Suburban will amortize the balance in the Interim Rates Memorandum Account through surcharges of \$0.230 and \$0.233 per 100 cubic feet water consumption applied to the quantity rates for San Jose Hills and Whittier/La Mirada Service Areas, respectively. A surcharge of \$0.174 per 100 cubic feet water consumption applied to recycled water customers, a surcharge of \$1.39 for each inch of diameter of service connection for Private Fire Protection

Service, and a monthly surcharge of \$1.29 for each 6-inch standard Fire Hydrant Service on Private Property.

Tier Designation and Effective Date

This is a Tier 1 filing – the advice letter is a compliance advice letter. Suburban requests processing by the Commission's Water Division so the surcharge will become effective on March 1, 2025.

In compliance with Water Industry Rule 4.1 of General Order 96-B, a copy of this advice letter has been mailed or electronically transmitted to all interested and affected parties as detailed in Attachment A.

Protest and Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

Grand Ave., Suite 100, Covina, CA 91724-4044, and email to kiki.carlson@nexuswg.com

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20-day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

Replies: The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Each reply must be received by the Division of Water and Audits within 5 business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response.

This filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, nor conflict with other schedules or rules.
